| <p>Key Knowledge</p> | <p>Dynasty means a succession of rulers from the same bloodline/family.</p> <p>Monarchy means the group of leaders to the throne, at the head is a monarch known as the King, Queen, Emperor or Empress.</p> <p>The Tudor dynasty began with Henry VII in 1485 and ended with Elizabeth I death in 1603.</p> | <p>The War of the Roses was a famous conflict that happened in England a long time ago, between the years 1455 to 1487. It got its name because the two main families involved in the war had symbols of roses - the Lancaster family had a red rose, and the York family had a white rose.</p> <p>The war started due to longstanding family feuds, weak leaders, competing claims to the throne, and power struggles following the death of important leaders.</p> | <p>The Battle of Bosworth in 1485 signified the end of the War of the Roses.</p> <p>Richard III (House of York) was killed by Henry VII (House of Lancaster) men at the battle.</p> <p>Henry VII was crowned King and created the Tudor rose – a rose that signified the joining of the Houses of York and Lancaster.</p> | <p>Henry VIII wanted to divorce Catherine of Aragon to marry Anne Boleyn and have a son.</p> <p>The Pope would not give Henry a divorce as it was against Catholic religion.</p> <p>Henry created the Church of England so he could divorce Catherine of Aragon.</p> <p>Henry had 6 wives by the end of his reign.</p> | <p>Tudor society was dominated by males, making it difficult for Elizabeth to prove herself.</p> <p>Women were seen as weaker and not fit to rule, they were expected to marry and have children.</p> <p>Opinions of Elizabeth?</p> | <p>King Philip of Spain wanted Mary Queen of Scots to be Queen of England – Elizabeth had her executed.</p> <p>King Philip wanted revenge, so he sent the Armada to attack England.</p> <p>Whilst the fleet was resting in France, the English Navy attacked and sunk most of the Armada.</p> | <p>Theatres were built to entertain people.</p> <p>The voyages of explorers like Walter Raleigh made England powerful and wealthy.</p> <p>Elizabeth's reign saw the birth of the slave trade.</p> <p>Poverty was a big issue during Elizabeth's reign – people were short of most basic needs.</p> |

| Task Oracy | <p>Children complete monarch picture quiz.</p> <p>Create a Tudor dynasty timeline; upload to Showbie with voice note explaining what a dynasty is.</p> | <p>Look at 4 sources to predict what the causes of the Wars were.</p> <p>Transformation/replacement Create a comic strip or a news report on the main causes of the Wars of the Roses.</p> | <p>Re-enact the battle of Bosworth: divide the children into the Yorks and Lancasters and select a Richard III and Henry VII.</p> <p>Do this as a whole class first, then split children into groups and ask them to act out the battle and film it.</p> | <p>Human timeline of the 6 wives. Children initially order them, using dates to help. Then discuss how each marriage ended.</p> <p>Create a 'Tudor tweet' from Henry VIII, using their knowledge of the reformation, his reasons for wanting a divorce and his plans on how to attain one (replacement).</p> | <p>Mini task: characteristics of a strong king, use this to make a comparison of why it was so difficult for Elizabeth to rule in a patriarchal society.</p> <p>Children to annotate a portrait of Elizabeth I with the different hidden Easter eggs that showed her as a strong and powerful monarch (replacement).</p> | <p>To create a poster acting as propaganda showing how Elizabeth led the Navy to victory.</p> | <p>To research in groups different areas of Tudor life (theatre, explorers, slave trade and poverty) and conclude through balanced argument whether Elizabeth's reign really was the Golden Age</p> <p>Prepare an argument for a debate on whether Elizabeth's reign was/was not the Golden Age.</p> <p>Talk tokens</p> |
